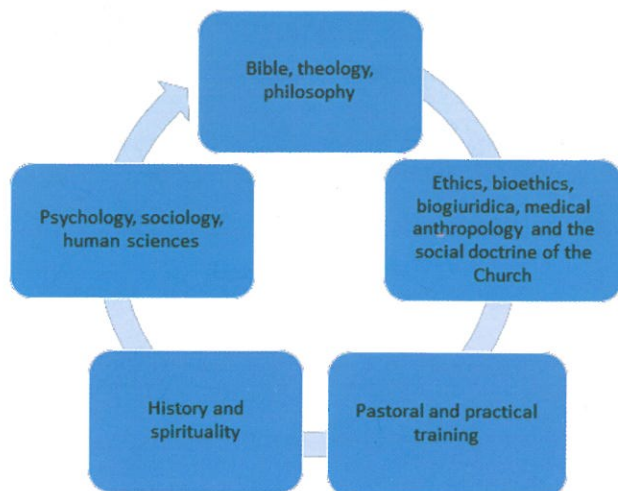
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Nature and objectives of Camillianum

- The Camillianum, inspired by the charism of St. Camillus de Lellis, is the only Academic Institute in Pastoral Health Care Theology.
- It is open to the global community and teaches to confront other cultural realities.
- It is annexed to the Faculty of Sacred Theology at the Pontifical Lateran University and offers a pastoral theology, a blend of theology, philosophy and human sciences.
- It has developed a school able to experience interdisciplinarity on issues of health, suffering, assistance and care.
- It holds together profiles theological and humanistic respecting the doctrine and openness to the demands of contemporary life.
- It promotes the humanization of the world of suffering and care.
- It prepares teachers in pastoral care theology, social welfare experts and representatives for the diocesan pastoral care.

Cycle of Licentiate

The courses of two-year licence, aimed at people who are in possession of the baccalaureate in theology, are also frequented by extraordinary students (not in possession of the Baccalaureate) to achieve a special diploma in Pastoral Health Care Theology.



The cycle of licence is divided into four semesters, for a total of at least 120 ECTS credits.

The following are the requirements for enrolling for the Licentiate:

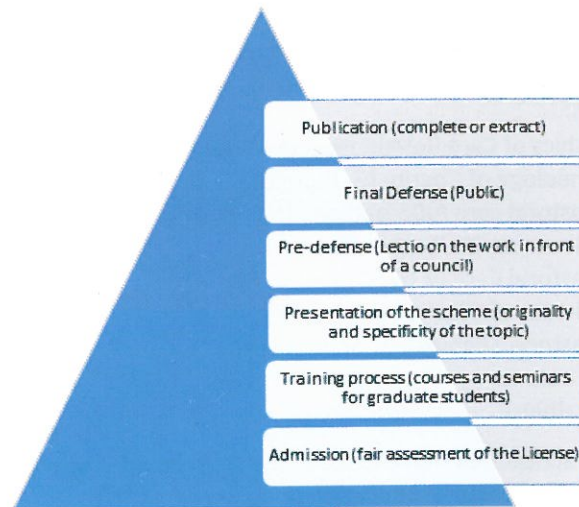
- Request for enrolment on the form provided by the secretary (see. <http://camillianum.it/images/modulistica/>).
- Original Diploma of Baccalaureate;
- Detailed certificate of study;
- Payment of fees;
- Two passport photos (write name and surname on the back)
- Nulla osta or letter of reference from an ecclesiastical authority

Doctoral Cycle

The process of Doctorate in Pastoral Theology Health is open to students who have obtained a Licentiate in the same specialization with a fair evaluation as well as those coming from other specializations canonical; in this case the student integrates some fundamental courses of License taking into account the study curriculum and research topic.

All students must attend the beginning of the path Seminars methodological them turned, and, every year, the intensive week on issues concerning the research areas of the Institute.

Process of doctoral research

 - c) a copy of the thesis of Licence

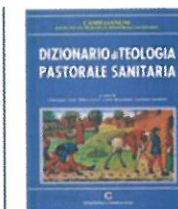
Library

The Institute Library has a collection of about 50,000



volumes and 375 magazines in the main languages, in the theological, philosophical and human sciences. The archive of the Library is accessible online and is an effective instrument also for researchers from other universities that deepen issues related to health and suffering. Monthly magazines are published online and also the presentation of the new acquisitions libraries; this allows constant monitoring of the cultural debate and guarantees, even to those not working directly with the Institute, a continuously updated.
